Brown, C. L. (2001-2003) The *Brown Economic Damages NetLetter* was launched on November 23, 2001 by Quicklaw (now subsumed into LexisNexis) and published until July 30, 2003 and encompassed 56 editions. The online *NetLetter* highlighted the court's decision on quantum and discussed the impact of forensic economic evidence (if called) or alternatively the judge's decisions on quantum without the benefit of expert economic evidence. The court's acceptance or rejection of economic methods and data were noted, as were issues such as mitigation, "loss of opportunity" or "loss of a capital asset", and in general the "art" of assessing damages. Each edition reviewed 2 to 4 published cases by Quicklaw.
